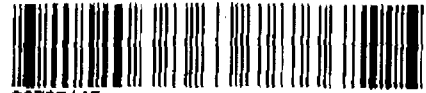

Oggetto: modifica Allegato I della Decisione (CE) n. 363/2005.

Si trasmette in allegato il documento della Commissione Europea concernente l'adozione di ulteriori misure di restrizione nei confronti della Peste Suina Africana in Regione Sardegna, approvato nel corso dell'ultimo Comitato per Catena Alimentare del 9 novembre u.s..

Tale atto è scaturito a seguito della preoccupante situazione epidemiologica della Regione Sardegna in relazione alla Peste Suina Africana, che ha visto una pesante recrudescenza dei focolai di malattia negli ultimi due mesi. Pertanto al fine di scongiurare la diffusione della malattia al restante territorio nazionale la Commissione, ha ritenuto

opportuno predisporre il divieto di esportazione dalla Regione Sardegna di carne suina e di prodotti a base di carne suina, ancorché provenienti dai stabilimenti all'uopo autorizzati ai sensi della Decisione di cui in oggetto (artt. 5 e 6).


Per tale motivo tutti i decreti di autorizzazione all'esportazione rilasciati dalla scrivente sono da intendersi temporaneamente sospesi.

Si fa presente che le disposizioni contenute nell'allegata Decisione hanno decorrenza immediata.

COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING DECISION

of

amending Commission Decision 2005/363/EC concerning animal health protection measures against African swine fever in Sardinia, Italy

(Text with EEA relevance)

THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Council Directive 89/662/EEC of 11 December 1989 concerning veterinary checks in intra-Community trade with a view to the completion of the internal market¹, and in particular Article 9(4) thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 90/425/EEC of 26 June 1990 concerning veterinary and zootechnical checks applicable in intra-Community trade in certain live animals and products with a view to the completion of the internal market², and in particular Article 10(4) thereof,

Having regard to Council Directive 2002/99/EC of 16 December 2002 laying down animal health rules governing the production, processing, distribution and introduction of products of animal origin for human consumption³, and in particular Article 4(3) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Commission Decision 2005/363/EC of 2 May 2005 concerning animal health protection measures against African swine fever in Sardinia, Italy⁴ was adopted in response to a serious recrudescence of African swine fever in domestic and feral pigs in the endemically infected island of Sardinia, Italy.
- (2) This Decision prohibits the dispatch from Sardinia of live pigs, their semen ova and embryos and of pig meat, pig meat products and any other products containing pig meat.
- (3) However, in accordance with Article 4(3) of Directive 2002/99/EC, the Decision provides for certain derogations as regards the dispatch of certain pig meat products derived from pigs originating in holdings outside the risk areas defined in Annex I to the Decision that meet specific biosecurity requirements.

- (4) During the past weeks Italy has informed the Commission of a significant increase in numbers and territorial extension of outbreaks of African swine fever in seven out of eight provinces of Sardinia, affecting also large commercial pig holdings.
- (5) The current disease evolution on Sardinia is liable to endanger the pig herds in other regions of Italy and in other Member States, in view of placing on the market of pig meat and pig meat products and any other products containing pig meat. It is therefore necessary to extend the risk areas in Annex I to Decision 2005/363/EC to the whole of the region of Sardinia. Consequently, since the conditions laid down in Article 5(2)(b) of Decision 2005/363/EC, the derogation granted to Italy to authorise the dispatch of pig meat from Sardinia to areas outside Sardinia, is suspended. The same applies to the derogation granted under Article 6 of that Decision, to authorise the dispatch of pig meat products and other products containing pig meat from Sardinia to areas outside Sardinia. Annex I to Decision 2005/363/EC should therefore be amended accordingly.
- (6) The measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the opinion of the Standing Committee on the Food Chain and Animal Health,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

Annex I to Decision 2005/363/EC is replaced by the text in the Annex to this Decision.

Article 2

This Decision is addressed to the Member States.
